### **JULY 25, FRIDAY      Denali National Park**

### **JULY 26, SATURDAY      Denali National Park – Anchorage by Rail**

This morning, board the luxurious domed rail cars of the McKinley Explorer bound for Anchorage. From ice-blue glaciers to beluga whales and the famous bore tide, a single cruise to Anchorage, Alaska will considerably shorten any nature-lover's bucket list. Nestled between mountains and the Cook Inlet terminus, near many national and state parks, this hospitable haven is one of the best places to see Alaska wildlife. A city moose roaming the streets (there are about 1,500) is a regular sight and views of whales, puffins, otters, and Dall porpoises going about their days is just a short excursion away. Cruises to Anchorage are a must for those that want some of the most incredible bear viewing in the country.

### **JULY 27, SUNDAY      Anchorage – Whittier by Rail**

Enjoy a scenic rail journey along picturesque Turnagain Arm aboard the cruisetrain before embarking your ship. Holland America Line's Alaska Cruise Tours now include the tiny town of Whittier. This remote village is nestled along breathtaking Prince William Sound, home to a stunning array of wildlife, including bald eagles, sea otters and killer whales, so have your camera ready. Whittier has the odd distinction of being almost entirely under one roof. No need to get in a car to go to the grocery store, bank or a friend's house. All town services are sheltered from the often-inclement weather in this unique and practical way, and virtually all of Whittier's approximately 220 residents live in the 14-story Begich Towers, originally a Cold War outpost for the U.S. Army. Not only will you experience Whittier's small town charm on Alaska cruise, there is also plenty of outdoor activities like fishing, hiking, scuba diving and kayaking. It is also known for its high concentration of glaciers.

## **JULY 28, MONDAY**

### **Cruising the Hubbard Glacier**

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Enjoy a leisurely day highlighted by afternoon scenic cruising to Hubbard Glacier - North America's longest tidewater glacier.

An Alaska cruise toward Hubbard Glacier feels like you're approaching another planet in a tiny space craft. It is that big and that otherworldly. Among all the vanishing Alaska glaciers, Hubbard has a rapidly advancing ice margin— up to seven feet in one day—earning it the nickname, “the Galloping Glacier.”

Hubbard Glacier cruises are so popular because of the glacier's three-story icebergs that cannon into crystal waters, a process called calving. It's also colorful. On clear days, Hubbard turns a stunning deep blue and on cloudy ones, its many ripples and icebergs shimmer in soft light.

This glacier dwarfs the other glaciers in Alaska. It is the longest tidewater glacier in North America and starts 122 kilometers (76 miles) back, pouring down off the shoulder of Mt. Walsh. It has an impressive terminal face that is 11 kilometers (7 miles) long and 106 meters (350 feet) above the water line, making its regular audience of Alaska cruise ships look like toy boats.

It's a giant, but it's not sleeping. Hubbard Glacier is one of the few Alaska glaciers that's advancing and not succumbing to climate change. It sounds uplifting, but many fear that the expanding glacier will block the entrance to the fjord.

## **JULY 29, TUESDAY**

### **Cruising the Glacier Bay**

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Cruise the ice-studded fjords of this national treasure for a full eight hours as a Park Service Ranger narrates. On your cruise to Glacier Bay, close your eyes and take in the sounds—the creaks and groans of “living” ice, the shrill cries of gulls and soaring eagles, the splash of a breaching humpback whale. Frosted peaks towering over mossy forests, wide tidewater glaciers (there are seven in the park), and marine wildlife are givens on Glacier Bay cruises, but every experience in this changing biosphere is unique.

Glacier Bay National Park & Preserve is best explored on an Alaska Cruise or an Alaska Land+ Sea Journey cruise tour. Our ships are perfectly sized for the optimal experience. Prepare for inclement weather, even in summer and dress for rain. Pack a hat, gloves, wool or fleece layers, a warm coat and waterproof gear to comfortably admire the landscape from the open deck of your ship. There are glaciers, fjords, inlets, rivers, streams and wildlife galore on Glacier Bay cruises, so bring those binoculars

## **JULY 30, WEDNESDAY**

### **Skagway**

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Step back to the days of the last great gold rush—choose from exciting shore excursions and still have time to shop. At the height of the Klondike Gold Rush, the port town of Skagway served as the primary gateway to the legendary gold fields, and quickly grew into Alaska's largest settlement. It was then a raucous frontier hub packed with trading

posts, saloons and guesthouses. As the gold rush faded into the 1900s, so did Skagway—but today it has been reinvigorated as a gateway for a new kind of visitor: those looking to explore Alaska's colorful history, pristine wildlife and unrivaled natural beauty.

Set sail on an Alaska Cruise and take an adventure in Skagway. At every turn, you'll find yourself immersed in gold rush lore, from the infamous Red Onion Saloon that still keeps a pistol that Wyatt Earp left behind en route to the Klondike, to the White Pass & Yukon Route Railroad, a classic narrow-gauge railway that traverses rugged mountains and passes cascading waterfalls and towering glaciers as it connects Skagway to Whitehorse deep in the Yukon. Known as the "Garden City of Alaska," Skagway is filled with beauty and nature. Explore the town on a Skagway excursion.

### **White Pass Summit Scenic Railroad (starting from \$160.00)**

#### **Nadine recommends this White Pass Summit Scenic Railroad**

Take an unforgettable round-trip journey aboard the **White Pass & Yukon Route Railroad**. Against all odds, this iron trail was built through some of the North's most ruggedly beautiful terrain and, more than 120 years later, is still in operation. Ride in a comfortable, restored or replica vintage rail car to the **summit of the White Pass**, through two tunnels, over sky-high trestles, and remote valleys. Pass Bridal Veil Falls, Inspiration Point and Dead Horse Gulch as your guide announces all points of interest and tells the story of the Klondike Gold Rush.

At the White Pass Summit at 2,865 feet, the train makes a loop and heads back down the pass, allowing everyone to experience excellent views during this round-trip rail journey. This narrow-gauge railroad is an **International Historic Civil Engineering Landmark**. It shares this honor with the Panama Canal, the Eiffel Tower and the Statue of Liberty and is truly a world wonder.

## **JULY 31, THURSDAY**

## **Juneau**

Enjoy a full day of exploring Alaska's capital—choose from exciting shore excursions and still have time to shop. Cruise to Juneau, Alaska and visit the most remote, most beautiful and strangest state capital in the United States. ### **Mendenhall Glacier, Hatchery, & Salmon Bake (starting at**

through Juneau's picturesque downtown to the mighty **Mendenhall Glacier**, a moving river of ice with rugged crevasses. Visit the **Macaulay Salmon Hatchery** and learn about the importance of Alaska's salmon and the impact these clever fish have on the environment and economy of the 49th state. Enjoy excellent eagle viewing and the variety of local marine life in aquariums. Then you'll board a motorcoach and head to the traditional Alaskan salmon bake at Salmon Creek. An Alaskan feast, this salmon bake features Alaskan-caught



wild salmon grilled over an open alderwood fire. Also enjoy barbecue ribs, cheesy au gratin potatoes, baked beans with reindeer sausage, wild-rice pilaf, fresh salads, cornbread and lemonade, coffee or tea. Beverages are available for purchase. Dine beside Salmon Creek in Southeast Alaska's rain forest and listen to a local musician. A translucent roof protects you, rain or shine. After dining, toast marshmallows over a crackling campfire and walk to view the beautiful Salmon Creek waterfall. Remnants of the historic Wagner Mine are evident here. Return to the ship by shuttle bus.

## **AUGUST 1, THURSDAY      Ketchikan**

Ketchikan is home to this dynamic experience that combines culture, history and cuisine. It takes place in scenic downtown Ketchikan's historic Thomas Basin district, where crab boats and the fishing fleet are moored. Ketchikan is also one of the best spots along the Inside Passage to explore the rich cultural sights of Native Alaskan nations like the Tlingit, Haida and Tsimshian. You can see intricately carved totem poles at the Totem Heritage Center and Totem Bight State Park. Visitors can try their luck on a sport fishing or simply savor the fresh seafood at one of the local restaurants.



**The Great Alaskan Lumberjack & Crab Feast**

At the adjacent Spruce Mill -- the largest Sitka spruce mill in the world -- the Great Alaskan Lumberjack Show pits world-champion athletes against each other. Fourteen rowdy, no-holds-barred competitive events include chopping, climbing, sawing, axe throwing, and log rolling, keeping you on the edge of your seat. Just a few steps away, the Harbor Haus overlooks the marina filled with fishing boats. Experience a delicious feast of Dungeness crab here, hosted by a family involved in the fishing industry. As you leave the venue, you're within walking distance of downtown Ketchikan, totems, the Creek Street historic district, a salmon stream, and fantastic shopping opportunities.



**Saxman Native Village, Dance Performance, & Totem Park (starting at \$85.00)**

This Saxman tour provides exclusive access to the Beaver Clan House, a working Native carving center, and a chance to view the traditional Native dancers first hand. You can't buy this tour elsewhere, so if you're going to Saxman Native Village make sure you are part of this genuine, up-close look at the rich living culture of Southeast Alaska's Native Americans. The Tlingits welcome you in the traditional style that defines the culture of Southeast Alaska. A short video program introduces you to the culture and history of Saxman. You will then enter the Beaver Clan House where you are welcomed by song and dance. Visitors are encouraged to participate in the final dance. At the Saxman Totem Park, discover one of the largest gatherings of totems in the world. Your guide will help unravel the mysteries of these towering, majestic poles. At the Village Carving Center, skilled craftsmen pass on their skill to eager apprentices.

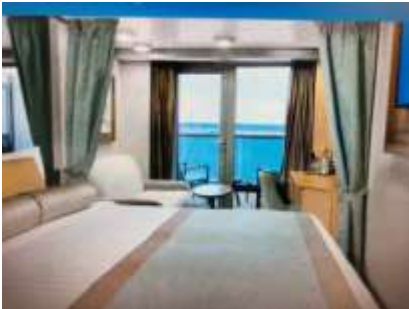
